There are a record number of attendees at conference this year (3,368). Approximately 3000 abstracts were submitted, 2000 papers were accept, and 1770 papers are including in proceedings.

ASEE membership is down to 13,063. A special projects fund is available for divisions that engage new faculty and encourage student participation to boost membership. More details coming soon.

A new rubric has been developed for the overall conference best paper award. In future years the best paper from the prior conference will be a distinguished lecture.

The criteria for selecting workshops and distinguished lectures will be distributed to promote transparency.

ASEE is considering the addition of "work in progress" sessions in a manner similar to that used at the Frontiers in Education (FIE) conference.

Monolith feedback is appreciated, but no decision on the system's continued use will be made for at least one more year.



## **Activities over past year**

## ASCE Student Chapters and International Student Groups

ASCE continues to play a key role in student development and education.

- Nearly 27,000 undergraduate students are currently student members of ASCE.
- Currently 287 ASCE Student Organizations
- O To prepare these rising leaders for our profession, the Committee on Student Activities (CSA) of EdAC hosted three Workshops for Student Chapter Leaders (WSCL) in conjunction with the 2011 Multi-Region Leadership Conferences. Overall attendance at the WSCL totaled 404 students representing 93 ASCE Student Organizations, including one AEI Student Chapter. Students departed the WSCLs informed, motivated, and energized for the challenges of leading their Chapters.
- o In addition to other activities, student leaders planned, coordinated, and conducted annual student conferences in 18 geographic regions during spring 2011. These Student Conferences typically host over 5,000 ASCE student members per year.
- 2011 Robert Ridgway Award for most outstanding ASCE Student Chapter was presented to the California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo ASCE Student Chapter in May 2011.
- 2011 Richard J. Scranton Outstanding Community Service Award recipient was The Citadel ASCE Student Chapter.

## CE Division's Historical Files

The Historian maintains many administrative documents (agendas, minutes, and treasurer reports), past newsletters, and approximately 120 copies of the booklet ASEE Civil Engineering Division -Divisions Chairs 1935-1993. These files are fairly complete for the period from 1975 to the present. There are no documents on file for any date prior to 1975. And the Historian maintains a database of Division Officers and award winners between 1975 and the present – available upon request.
